1. Welcome address and apologizes

The meeting starts with a welcome address by the President Remco Koerts, which is followed by a brief introduction into the most important items of the agenda of the day and its approval.

Several persons can only be temporarily present, as National Representative Ilze LOCMANE and Vice-President Michel LANNERS, whose presentation of the Academic Program will be done by Neeme RAND. Klaus ENENGL, absent, prepared a report which will be presented by Ana Paula PAIS.

2. Approval of the minutes of the previous meeting (online meeting, December 2nd, 2021)

The above-mentioned minutes published on the AEHT website <u>www.aeht.eu</u> are approved unanimously by the delegates present.

3. Report of the President (Remco KOERTS)

In December, the Executive Board authorized the Presidium to run the AEHT Head Office without permanent staff member. It will certainly take time to implement all changes, but Vice-President Michel LANNERS already released a teacher from his school to take over some of the tasks. Ronny THILL is very familiar with the AEHT as he endorses for several years now the function of AEHT Head Judge and is already very well-known by AEHT members.

For years the AEHT seeks the involvement of more and more students in its developments, and Remco KOERTS is pleased to announce that:

• five brand new promotional videos made by San Ignatius College of Barcelona are now available on our web site and YouTube channel. The overall AEHT promotional video can e.g., be found

- under http://www.aeht.eu/en/presentation-of-the-aeht). Remco KOERTS thanks warmly Jordi OLLE and his students for all the work done to produce these videos.
- an AEHT App is currently being developed by students of ROC Mondriaan in The Hague to be used all year round for all main AEHT activities. In Tallinn, the App will be launched and tested for improvements.

4. 2021 Elections (Ana Paula PAIS)

New elections are scheduled in two phases, the first to elect the National Representatives and the second for the elections of the Presidium members. The calendar set is as follows:

	Reminder: article 13 "Elections" § 3-4 of the Association's House Rules states: "Since each member of the Executive Board represents a country, the election is strictly personal, and there are no proxy votes" "Only those members present may vote, and voting is by secret ballot."

Elections in two phases:

In the spring, elections for National Representatives will take place, followed, at the Annual Conference in Tallinn, by elections for the Presidium from among the newly elected National Representatives (see details above).

All school representatives can stand in the elections and will receive the same form by email to submit their candidacy. However, only school headmasters or heads of hospitality or tourism departments are eligible, and the Presidium must check their compliance with the rules. In countries where there will be more than one candidate, a second round with a different electronic ballot is necessary to ask the national schools to decide between the candidates. A third round may afterwards be necessary if there is a tie between candidates. In case of a third round, the deadline of 11 June could possibly not be respected in the relevant countries, but all newly elected National Representatives should be known by the end of June.

In the second phase, the newly elected National Representatives will be invited to apply for a position in the Presidium. Those who wish to stand for election to the Presidium must submit their political statement by September 24th, 2021.

5. Report of the Vice-Presidents

Report on an improved cooperation with AEHT PPP as well as on the organization of new online on- and off-congress competitions (Ray CULLEN)

Following on from the success of the online competition organized in the framework of the AEHT Annual Conference 2020, the thinking was to create new competitions that:

- can be delivered online,
- are available during the year,
- give opportunities for students at different levels to compete,
- give an opportunity for students who would not normally come to the competitions to compete.
- and to help strengthen the presence of AEHT online, through these new competitions.

As a result, following new and restructured competitions saw the light:

1) <u>Hospitality Management Blended Competition</u> (based a proposal by Paulo VAZ) This restructured competition, is organized in two phases, with phase 1 held online from March/after Easter till October and phase 2 held during the Annual Conference.

- PHASE 1 (after Easter till October)
 - limited to 15/20 teams' of 3/4 students involved;
 - will run over a 6-month timeline, beginning in March or after Easter, with a break in July and August and ending in October;
 - with two tutorial meetings held monthly to support and help students and to have their results presented and commented on with guidelines;
 - all the teams will be invited to participate in phase 2 (the big final) that occurs during the AEHT Annual Conference;
 - CESIM will be motivated about the possibility to integrate some ODS in the game algorithm, so that students can be aware of its impact both positive and negative.

• PHASE 2

All the teams from phase 1 will be kept for phase 2.

- The test involving Robert Bosma, or another Expert's Masterclass, will be kept, but will be answered within the group, so it will become a group exercise promoting cross learning, decision making, etc., with the obtained classifications being used to achieve final

- classifications. It is not an individual session; the individual teams must work together to produce the outcomes of the tests.
- Teams will present their strategies, conclusions and decision-making process in public and in front of a judging board composed by two members of AEHT schools (not voting on their own schools), one member of local trade, one CESIM representative and a Vice-President (with no vote) representing AEHT.
- In Tallin the new competition year-round starting 2022 will be launched.

• The new competition strategy

- Intention is to have all the online participants present at the Annual Conference.
- The competition should be designed to be a consulting intervention on the local hospitality industry or a specific hotel or hotel (online) concerning *innovation*, *sustainability* (mandatory), technology and digital, social responsibility, with teams designing new and different approaches to existing problems in the local industry.
- The competition will be specific for higher level students at level 5 or higher.
- Supported by our professional partners (e.g. Share Centre)
- It is proposed to run a Pilot Edition in Tallin.

• Important note for the new competition

- Ray CULLEN and Paulo VAZ held a meeting with Stephen Hood from STR Centre in order to ask for its cooperation and support, namely by allowing access to data concerning the theme and region, to present a Masterclass about the importance of data for managing and preparing the future and to incorporate the judging panel.
- the National Representatives are being asked to inform us about the higher-level schools that are in their countries and promote the competition amongst them.
- to better promote, the student participant profile needs to be defined, not to separate but to reinforce the need of specific skills and knowledge to enable the student to participate with confidence and in the belief of success.
- the competitions need to be promoted to all higher education schools, whether they are AEHT members or not.

National Representatives are invited to identify further schools in their country that offer level 5 and up training and to encourage them to enter the competition.

2) Additional new competition in the field of Tourism Destinations: 100% online (based on a proposal by Ásdis ÓSKARSDÓTTIR VATNSDAL)

The competition will be held online every year in the springtime – late March to April (depending on Easter holidays).

- This competition will be totally different from the regular Tourist Destination Competition held during the Annual Conference.
- The competition will be open to all AEHT member schools. Only one competitor per school is allowed. Minimum language requirement: European Language Level B2.
- The competition theme will focus on tourism within Europe with a special emphasis on *sustainable travel and responsible tourism*.
- The theme for each year will be decided by the competition organizer. Teams will deliver a presentation online on the competition theme.

- Teams will be composed of two members of different nationalities. Teams will be drawn by random selection and care will be taken that no competitors from the same country are drawn together.

Some competition details

- Teams will be drawn ten days prior to the announced delivery of the presentation.
- The competition theme will be announced at a joint briefing for all competitors held via Teams seven days before the date of the presentation.
- At this briefing, the competing teams will also deliver a short presentation to introduce themselves, their school and their countries to all the other competitors. This helps build up a sense of community as technical issues may prevent other teams from viewing the competition.
- Teams have one week to work on the competition assignment. During the competition, teams are given 15 minutes to deliver their presentation and answer questions from the judging panel.
- A follow-up session will be given after the competition in order to highlight 'best practice' in a presentation competition.
- Note: the judges' decision is always final and no discussions regarding grading and places will happen during the follow-up session.

3) Additional new competition in the field of Front Office – 100% online

(based on a proposal by Emil JUVAN)

- This competition will be totally different from the regular Front Office Competition held during the Annual Conference.
- This new competition will be benefiting students and teachers/lecturers in the adoption and acknowledgement of knowledge demonstration (students) and knowledge provision (teachers) skills in the context of *Front Office Sales & Marketing Operations*.
- The context or the focus of the new competition is keeping relations with "out of the house" guests.
- Teachers (knowledge providers) will provide knowledge on front office operations focusing on catering to future client business. Students (competitors) will learn and demonstrate skills in communicating with future clients of the study hotel.
- Specific skills covered are:
 - o Promotion
 - o Sales/up-sale
 - Information provision
 - o Negotiation.

The focus

- Students (competitors) will learn and demonstrate skills in communicating with future clients of the study hotel.

New Competition uniqueness

- Sustainability: acknowledging and promoting sustainable behaviour of providers and consumers in the hospitality industry.
- *Innovation:* adopting and promoting innovative ways of customer relationship management (e.g. virtual welcome, promoting ESB of hotel guests, sustainable market positioning, etc.).
- Distinctiveness: Focus of the proposed competition is 'out of the house' guest and contactless services.
- The traditional Front Office competition deals with 'in house guests' and contact services.

Ray Cullen finishes his presentation with an **end note** emphasizing that:

- these are exciting new competitions which include the opportunity for students/ teachers to gain new insights and knowledge from a different perspective.
- all three have a focus on Sustainability and Innovation.
- all the competitions are designed to give students new and updated real world knowledge with the support of AEHT education experts and industry global partners.

In brief, competitions for the Annual Conference 2021 (AC2021), stay the same as in former years with one addition, the pilot of the more strategic Hospitality Management Competition. In other words, there will be 11 competitions organized in Tallinn. The former Hospitality Management Competition will remain the same for 2021, but in Tallinn the new concept of this competition will be presented: starting in approximately March 2022 and ending at the Annual Conference 2022. The two above-mentioned new 100% online competitions will be presented in Tallinn and launched for the first time somewhere around March 2022.

Ray CULLEN expresses his warmest thanks to Asdis ÓSKARSDÓTTIR VATNSDAL, Emil JUVAN, Paulo VAZ and Theo VERKOYEN for their work and leadership regarding these competitions.

Remco KOERTS stresses the extra added value for the AEHT of all these new competitions. In Ireland only 2 of the 5 Higher Education (HE) schools are so far involved and Ray CULLEN hopes that all these innovations may attract new members.

Paulo APRILE promises to check for new HE schools in Italy. He might contact the Suisse Educational Group in Montreux for us to get them involved with the support of Ray CULLEN's presentation.

Report on the AEHT IT Services (Internet site, Conference registration platform, ...) and on the Office 365 use within the AEHT (Neeme RAND)

Neeme RAND expresses his most sincere thanks to our webmaster, Ahti PAJU, for his exemplary availability and for his invaluable assistance in IT matters. Thanks to him, the AEHT obtained Office 365 for free.

Regarding the elections in 2021, a full task from one of the vice-presidents will be required to make - in cooperation with the whole AEHT community - AEHT more visible on social media.

Report on the implementation of the "Academic Program" for directors (and teachers) at the AEHT Annual Conference (Neeme RAND)

In the absence of Vice-President Michel LANNERS, Neeme RAND briefly presented the specific program of this year's academic session.

In brief, the arrival day will be Wednesday, November 3rd, special activities are planned for Thursday and Friday, and the return home is scheduled for Saturday. There will be a welcome address by the AEHT President, a guided tour of Tallinn, the General Assembly, academic seminars with excellent speakers, and an exclusive dinner. In addition, the group can take part in the official social program and attend the gala dinner with prize-giving ceremony on the closing night.

To Tanja ANGLEITNER-SAGADIN's question about the possibility for judges to participate in the academic program, Neeme RAND replied that everything will be done to make this possible. For the

time being, it is planned that teachers who wish to do so can participate in the academic program on Thursday, but the whole program still needs to be refined.

Neeme RAND invites the audience to help the AEHT to promote this program in their country in order to attract as many headmasters and teachers as possible.

Report on the coordination of the AEHT NR network and implementation
of a series of online webinars in the framework of the AEHT Academy (Ray
CULLEN, Sanne HUYGENS and Ana Paula PAIS)

Under the leadership of Ray CULLEN, Sanne HUYGENS and Ana Paula PAIS, the AEHT will launch a forum for its associates. The proposal reads as follows:

- To work with our National Representatives, directors and teachers and educators for the benefit of all.
- This forum is open to all our members.
- Strengthen the bond between the Presidium and the members, particularly NR
- To help grow the organization together and support the needs of our members.
- · To add value for our professional partners and industry experts.
- Sessions will be held in a series of monthly meetings (last Wednesday of the month) over a 6 month timeframe, noting periods for holidays, key educational events and our annual conference.
- Proposed dates 2021/2022
- · 2021 April 28th: May 26th: September 29th
- 2022 Jan 26th: Feb 24th: March 30th: April 27th: May 25th: September 28th.

In December 2020, 120 schools were in arrears with their 2020 subscriptions alone, creating a large gap in the AEHT's financial budget. Thanks to specific actions taken by Klaus and a member of Roc Mondriaan's staff, we have managed to recover half of these payments. We now need the help of the National Representatives to recover the remaining invoices.

As far as the invoices for the 2021 dues are concerned, they will be sent on March 31st, 2021 to all our members.

7. Treasurer's report (Ana Paula PAIS)

Klaus Enengl, who has agreed to postpone his retirement from the AEHT until the 2021 Annual Conference, will present us in Tallinn with a detailed report and charts on the new development this year and in the future of the AEHT's financial situation since the recent reorganisation. Up till now the AEHT is still able to meet all its obligations due to the fact that the 2020 subvention from the Luxembourg Ministry of Education has just arrived on our bank account. Currently EUR 17,000 are on its ordinary bank accounts and EUR 23,000 on its savings account. This is a very modest amount but seems sufficient to meet our financial obligations in the upcoming period.

Remco KOERTS states that, based on the report of the Treasurer, he is pleased that the restructuring decision was taken at our last meeting.

Besides the webinars, that have already been presented earlier in this meeting, there are several other events on our calendar on which it will be necessary to say a few words:

- 1) **22nd edition of the Bartolomeo Scappi International Competition** (bar, barista sommelier, pastry, cooking, oenogastronomic exhibition competitions) in Castel San Pietro Terme, Italy, scheduled in April 2021 was definitely cancelled for this year due to the pandemic.
- 2) **The 15th Bartender G&T Competition 2021** organized by the Vocational College for Catering and Tourism Bled in Slovenia, will be held as planned on April 14th and 15th. (**NB.:** *Please note that 5 days after the meeting, the organizers informed us that due to the recent lockdown in Slovenia the event had to be postponed for one week to April 21st 22nd). The organizing school*

found a nice way to organize their traditional competition in an online setting. How could it be otherwise, the topic this year is "online mixing".

The competition is split in three parts:

- <u>Production of a video</u> in English max 2 min. on the competitor, his hobbies, his school and the town of his school, the main attractions, the cocktail that will be prepared and the story on it
 - o to be sent in with the recipe and photo of the cocktail
 - o to be shown before the competitor's performance.

Cocktail preparation

- o to be prepared live in front of the camera
- o to be done in 7 min in 4 portions with decoration
- o to be based on an <u>original creation</u> of the competitor
- o using imperatively their <u>main sponsor's G3 Spirits beverages</u>
- o using <u>many ingredients</u> as desired (no homemade ingredients)
- o prepared at the same time by a bartender at Bled college to be tasted by the judges.
- o assessed according to IBA (International Bartender Association) rules.

- Oral presentation

- a 2 min presentation on the cocktail creation followed by some communication with the judge (live) immediately after the live mixing.
- o a good story about the inspiration for the cocktail and its preparation
- Deadline for registration is April 1st, 2021 (<u>postponed</u> till April 8th, 2021).

3) Competition Olivier ROELLINGER held in live in September – October 2021

Olivier ROELLINGER, a French Michelin 3-star chef from 2006 to 2008, launched a competition to make the next generation of chefs, waiters and young professionals aware of their vital role in preserving sea resources by promoting sustainable, and often lesser-known maritime species.

The competitions address also these three categories of participants:

- 'Chefs' contest (for students and professionals from Europe) is organized in three parts:
 - First part: Preparation in 2 hours 30 minutes max. of a gourmet style recipe, based on a sustainable fish species, accompanied by a sustainable shellfish, crustacean or algae.
 - Second part: Preparation in 30 minutes max. of a 'home-made' style recipe, with the same species of fish used in the gourmet recipe, which could be cooked at home.
 - Third part: an oral presentation on sustainability with a role play between the candidate and jury members and an exchange on the preservation of marine resources.
- 'Waiters' contest (Students from Europe) is organized in two parts:
 - First part: "a practical test' by five workshops.
 - Second part: an oral presentation on sustainability with a role play between the candidate and jury members and an exchange on the preservation of marine resources.
- For the <u>contest for young professionals</u>, please refer to the documents published on the AEHT web site.

Please note that there are still places available for these competitions, especially in the waiters' category. The deadline for registration was initially set for January 10th, 2021 but has been extended to the end of April.

- 4) Regarding the Youth Parliament, Ana Paula PAIS declares that, with the help of Canan CELIK, they are maintaining the organization of this event in Sétubal in 2021 somewhere around September-October, but in a smaller version and only if the circumstances make it possible. This event is also important for the election of a Student AEHT President representing our students within the association. If held, the only costs that students will have to bear will be their travel costs.
- 5) As regards the 10th edition of the **HEG seminar** for teachers and directors, Paulo VAZ is still very motivated to organize it in Pontevedra. This city located in Galicia, also bears an opportunity for the AEHT to recruit new members from Spain.

10. Christmas in Europe event 2021 (Ray CULLEN)


